The Balsam Fir prefers full sun to partial shade and does best in moist soil.

It has a slow growth rate and a mature height of 40 to 60 feet.

The balsam fir is a source of food for many forms of wildlife, including birds, squirrels, mice, voles, moose and deer. Moose and deer and small animals also rely on the trees for shelter from the elements. Beavers use the bark of this tree to build dams. They are also the most popular choice for Christmas trees.
